With many thanks to our greenkeeper Ian, the golf course is holding up well under the conditions. The greens and tees have certainly benefited from the regular verti-draining. The greens in particular are in good order for this time of the year, this is because of the regular spray programme.

PLEASE LOOK AFTER THE GOLF COURSE BY REPLACING DIVOTS AND REPAIRING PITCH MARKS THAT YOU OR OTHERS MAKE.

Wood from the trees cut down is being split and is available to members for half the price of commercial wood merchants. First in first serve. Talk to Jean if you want some firewood for next year.

The hawthorn hedge has started to be taken out, this will be completely removed. Replacement planting has not been decided on yet. The photinia hedge has been trimmed, this requires a lot more work to get it back to manageable growth. Work continues in trimming trees and other general tidying up.

We have obtained a quantity of topsoil, this will be used to enlarge some tee areas and repair areas where root pruning was done, also areas that have become eroded and made bare of grass.

There is a lot of improvement work being done around the course, therefore you should make yourself familiar with the local rules and rules of golf particularly regarding drains, wheel marks, GUR etc.

Rules Corner

The men's Tasman Quadrangular and the women's Lucas Salver/ May Rowling events were recently held at Greenacres, both events were match play format with a field of 80 players, who more than likely had quite a mix of the understanding of the Rules of Golf.

Here's just three situations that needed assistance. See how you would Rule, answers on next page.

Q1. A player's ball lies on the fringe of a putting green. The player decides to place her ball so she can get a better line of putt. Having correctly placed her ball within the 1 club length permitted she realises that a 'second' hole on the green which has a plastic cap is now on her line of play. As she is off the green there is no relief available.

She decides she was better off with the original lie and places her ball back where it was. Her opponent tells her she cannot and so they call for a Rules official.

Q2. A player's ball lies under some trees directly behind a mound of twigs and pine cones which are piled for removal and therefore classed as GUR. The mound interferes with the player's swing. Having correctly taken relief and dropped in the relief area the player now realises that he needs to play a very low shot to keep under overhanging branches further ahead and the 'pile' is now directly on his line of play. He calls over a Rules official to ask what are his options.

Q3. A player's ball from the tee on # 7 [Greenacres] comes to rest in the estuary [red penalty area]. The player is aware that to take lateral relief [dropping within 2 club lengths of the last point of entry] the area would put her directly behind a tree/bush on her line of play. She's reluctant to go back to the tee and so opts to take back-on-the-line relief. Her opponent tells her she cannot and so the player calls for a Ruling.

9 Hole Ladies Report

July was a good month with the weather being kind and all our competition days being completed. The highlight was the Inter club played at Tasman. Well done to Lyn, Clare, Rae, and Sue, who had three wins and a draw between them. After this week, looking forward to the warmer spring weather coming soon.









Rules Corner - What's the Ruling?

A1. Preferred Lies [placing] is a Local Rule when in place and only permits a player to place once only. In the question, the player had already correctly placed her ball and she does not get to place her ball again. Once placed that's it..it's in play. The same applies anywhere when placing, if you manage to place your ball on a good piece of grass and it falls off its perch whilst you select your clubtough, you now play as it lies. You do not get to place your ball again. In this case the player must replace the ball to where she first placed and gets a one stroke penalty for moving her ball without authority.

A2. Here the player understood how to take relief and did so correctly. If the ball when dropped is dropped correctly and the ball stays within the relief area, then the ball is in play. You do not get to drop again because you don't like where it now lies, same applies if the ball ends up in a divot hole. In the question the player's options are play as it lies or declare it unplayable for a penalty of one stroke. However, the player may clear as much of the pile on his line as he wishes without penalty as the pile is made up of loose impediments.

- A3. Generally when taking relief from a Penalty Area you have three options:
 - i] Stroke & distance [go back to where you played your last stroke]
 - ii] Take 'back-on-the-line' relief [line from flagstick to ball and as far back as you want on the line and must be outside the penalty area]
- iii] Lateral relief drop a ball within 2 club lengths of point of entry In this situation at Greenacres the estuary /penalty area only has markers on the course side and that's because the other side goes to 'infinity', there is nowhere to drop back-on-the-line so she must play as it lies or take option i] or iii] for a one stroke penalty
