### From the Course Convenor

The weather, particularly lack of rain, continues to play havoc with the maintenance and good condition of the whole golf course. The fairways and rough are slow in growing. The green you see in the grass is lacking any substance and heavy frosts will not help, in fact will be detrimental to the health of the grass.

Your greenkeeper Ian continues to do an excellent job in maintaining the good condition of the greens. The regular spray programmes are really showing great results. However if we had some rain it would be even better.

YOU CAN HELP IMPROVE THE CONDI-TION OF THE COURSE BY REPLACING DIVOTS AND REPAIRING PITCH MARKS

The large oak tree stump by the sheds is being removed so that a 'portacom' building can be put up for the greenkeepers office and to store course maintenance products. Space will be freed up in the existing shed so that machine maintenance/repair work can be done out of the rain and wind.

Prunings and other rubbish in the heap behind number five green has been burnt off. This area will be tidied up and gorse, broom and thistles sprayed.

Work continues in trimming trees and other general tidying up.

The clay area beside number 12 tee will be roped off over winter to prevent people slipping and injuring themselves. Planning is underway for a long term solution for this area.

## Rules Corner - True or False Golf Ball Myths

There are quite a number of myths on the course surrounding the ball you are playing with, here are a few general misunderstandings:-

Before starting a round of golf a player must announce to his fellow competitor or opponent the make and number of the ball he is about to tee off with.

False - A player is responsible for playing the proper ball [his ball in play] and should put an identification mark on his ball to avoid any dispute. There is no obligation for him to announce the make and number; however it is generally good practice to do so.

A player wishing to change his ball in between holes must announce his intention to his fellow competitor or opponent.

False - A player may play with a different ball for each hole played if he so wishes and there is no obligation to make any announcement but there is no harm in doing to avoid any confusion. However, a player must not change his ball during the play of a hole unless permitted under the Rules e.g. ball out of bounds.

A player wishing to play a provisional ball for a ball that may be lost outside a water hazard or may be out of bounds must announce the make and number of both his original ball and the provisional ball.

False - Again the responsibility lies with the player to be able to identify both the original and provisional ball. There is no need to make any announcement; however, it is good practice to do so to avoid any dispute that may arise should both balls be found in the same vicinity.

If a player plays a provisional ball in case his original ball has come to rest out of bounds and subsequently finds his original ball in play but unplayable, he may choose to continue with his provisional ball if he so wishes.

False - If the player finds his original ball in play, the provisional ball must be abandoned and he must continue play with the original ball or proceed under the unplayable ball rule.

*If a player needs to lift his ball to identify it he must first call over his opponent or marker to observe the procedure.* 

False - The player may lift [or rotate] the ball to identify it but the spot of the ball must first be marked and it must not be cleaned more than needed to identify it. There is no longer any need for an opponent or marker to observe the procedure.

#### In stroke play a player may declare his ball on the green 'as marked' in order that other players may continue putting without risk of penalty.

False - If a player's ball in motion after a stroke on the putting green strikes another ball in play and at rest on the putting green, he is penalised two strokes and must now play his ball as it lies. The fact that the ball at rest was declared 'as marked' is irrelevant and the player cannot avoid the penalty. Always insist other players mark the position of their balls on the green before you putt.
